This is the part that needed the most effort in terms of:


- Persistence when the going got tough;

Resilient Schools Update

As winter sets in and the threat of adverse weather increases, Scottish Borders Schools are planning their Resilient Schools arrangements.

The purpose of Resilient Schools is an attempt to keep the economy moving and essential services open as part of a wider Scottish Borders response to the effects of adverse weather.

In the case of adverse weather, a decision will be made by the Chief Executive and Senior Management Team to invoke Resilient Schools across the Borders. In this event the following procedures will be put into action:

Parents will be notified by 'Group Call' that Resilient Schools arrangements are in place. This is the responsibility
of staff at Head Quarters. Information updates will be available via Radio Borders and the SBC Website. Please
ensure we have the most up to date mobile number for you and contact the school office with your new
number.

What does this mean for Chirnside Primary School?

Due to expected resilient schools staff being available on a vastly reduced basis, should Resilient Schools be invoked, the following arrangements have been planned for:

- Mrs. Jayne Waite, Head Teacher of Swinton and Greenlaw Primary Schools will manage the school.
- Primary 5, Primary 6 and Primary 7 stages will be open <u>only</u>.
- Only pupils who usually walk to school should attend. The final decision for these pupils to attend lies with the parent.
- Due to reduced staffing numbers because of available Resilient Schools staff, we are able to open P5-P7 based on the known walking pupil numbers. Therefore, pupils who usually travel on school transport, or with parents from outside the village, **should not attend school**.

Breakfast Bar

Last term we ran a Breakfast Club for pupils to gauge interest and need for this service. It proved to be very popular with pupils. As a result of this market research, we have decided to reopen our Breakfast Bar in the canteen on a term by term basis.

Opening times for the Breakfast Bar are 8.30am – 8.50am (last serving at 8.45am). On offer are cereals, fruit, milk and water. There is a small charge of 20p per pupil per day for this service.

Improving Learning Update:

Last month (November 2015):

- Mrs Reap worked with other primary teachers from Berwickshire cluster schools on 'Critical Reading'
 approaches. She has been using these approaches on a 'test for change' basis with her Primary 5 class to
 develop a wider range of reading skills with her pupils. This will continue for the remainder of this session,
 with a view to adopting these approaches across classes next school session 2016-17.
- We explored the theme of inclusion, with specific focus on Educational Psychology Service and Berwickshire Support Centres to ensure a better understanding of what these services can provide in supporting children's learning and additional needs.
- We moderated pupil writing samples to ensure we are maintaining appropriate standards and expectations across classes in terms of progression and pupil attainment.
- We revisited previous teacher learning in relation to Modern Languages and the teaching of French across primary classes.
- Attended a Berwickshire wide In-service morning at Berwickshire High School with a focus on better teaching, better learning for all. The morning offered teachers a choice of practical workshops to attend and also a keynote speech from Service Director Donna Manson on the themes of inclusion and pupil achievement.
- Some teachers continued to develop 'Practitioner Enquiry' approaches to develop an aspect of their teaching practice and evaluate the impact of this upon pupils' learning.
- A group of teachers will continue to develop a teaching and learning progression for Religious and Moral Education.
- Some teaching staff attended a twilight Child Protection Training Refresher at Ayton Primary School to ensure all our staff are up to date in their training requirements in this area.
