### SCHOOL UNIFORM

School uniform at Chirnside Primary School is as follows (from school handbook):

- Boys: Trousers- black or grey; Shirt white or navy; Pullover/Sweatshirt (P1-6) navy
- Girls: Skirt / Trousers navy, grey or black; Blouse white or navy; Pullover/Cardigan/Sweatshirt navy
- Primary 7 pupils should purchase a 'Senior Pupil' sweatshirt in grey.
- Children should wear shorts and T-shirt for all P.E. activities. Shirts worn in school should not show any advertising for alcohol. As P.E. or Movement activities take place more than once a week, it would be useful if P.E. kits could remain in school, taking them home for washing at appropriate times.

- All children's school clothing should be clearly named so that it can be easily identified if mislaid. Please help with this.

# **SAVE A LIFE FOR SCOTLAND**

There is a current government strategy to improve the survival chances of people who have a cardiac arrest out of hospital.

A body called "Save a Life for Scotland" have been charged with improving the number of ordinary people who know how to administer CPR. Their target is to reach 500,000 trained people by 2020.

There's a big push to train younger people in schools and, under the "I'll do it!" banner, there are resources available to support the training of primary and secondary pupils.

Mr Brodie has brought 5 CPR mannequins in to school and now Primary 5 can be added to the number of trained people who know how to do CPR. Over time, Mr Brodie and Primary 5 pupils will train the whole school to be a part of this.
