Dear Parents, Pupils and Staff,

I had the pleasure of accompanying Primary 7 pupils last Tuesday evening to Selkirk High School. Our pupils had qualified for the Borders Rotary Quiz Final and were representing Berwickshire Schools. They had earned this privilege by winning the Berwickshire Schools Final in February. There were eight rounds of five questions, testing children's knowledge about the world.

Several head teachers were present, including myself, and we were getting quite competitive as each round progressed. However, I'm not sure that a quiz or a test is the most reliable method of assessing intelligence (I was third out of four head teachers, by the way).

One of our development focuses this session has been to 'Make Thinking Visible'. Educational research tells us that how pupils' think is a vitally important component to children's learning. We have been developing approaches in classrooms to develop children's thinking abilities, leading

pupils to develop their capability to question what they think they know. This in turn promotes better engagement in learning, develops pupil confidence, and a deeper understanding of the world around them.

Therefore as teachers and parents, encouraging our children to question the world around them, helps them to develop a deeper understanding of it and a growing

interest in learning, not to mention ensuring an increasing number of future quiz champions!

Pupil Equity Fund

In August, Chirnside Primary School will receive Pupil Equity Funding of £37,200. This money is awarded to schools by Scottish Government. The purpose of the funding is to support developments and approaches designed to close the gap between lowest and highest achieving pupils in schools. Each school is required to submit a plan to show how they will use the additional funding to address their attainment gap.

Our main proposal is to use our PEF to recruit two part-time classroom assistants, to work under the direction of our Support for Learning Teacher and Class Teachers. Classroom Assistants will deliver targeted support in Literacy and Numeracy to identified individuals and small groups, on a little and often basis (short sessions on a daily basis).

"Alert to Parents - Blue Whale Challenge"

Dear Parent/Carer,

We have been advised by PC Sharon Lackenby to share the following information with parents regarding a dangerous online game called the Blue Whale Challenge.

The Blue Whale Challenge is an internet based game that has resulted in many deaths in several countries; Russia has attributed over 130 deaths to this. The challenge is believed to be spreading across Europe; Belgian and French police officially warned parents and teenagers after three cases were reported in Belgium recently.

The administrator / curator of the challenge picks on vulnerable children and adults and gives them 50 challenges over a period of weeks, which culminates in suicide (challenge number 50).

The majority of the challenges involve self-harm followed by sending a picture to the curator as proof. If a child is identified within these challenges please get advice immediately, contact the school, the police or Children's Services


School Uniform

A reminder to parents regarding school uniform orders for next session went home last week. Parents can order via the school office or online. Orders to the office should be made by Tuesday 30th May. Orders on line can be made up to 5th June. All orders made during these times can be delivered to school for collection. Any orders placed after these deadlines can be delivered to school and collected on 14th August (Inset) or 15th August (Pupils return to school).

School uniform at Chirnside Primary School is as follows (from school handbook):

- Boys: Trousers- black or grey; Shirt white or navy; Pullover/Sweatshirt (P1-6) navy
- Girls: Skirt / Trousers navy, grey or black; Blouse white or navy; Pullover/Cardigan/Sweatshirt navy
- Primary 7 pupils should purchase a 'Senior Pupil' sweatshirt in grey.
- Children should wear shorts and T-shirt for all P.E. activities. Shirts worn in school should not show any advertising for alcohol. As P.E. or Movement activities take place more than once a week, it would be useful if P.E. kits could remain in school, taking them home for washing at appropriate times.
- Each child should have a painting / craft smock e.g. old shirt, apron.
- All children's school clothing should be clearly named so that it can be easily identified if mislaid. Please help with this.









